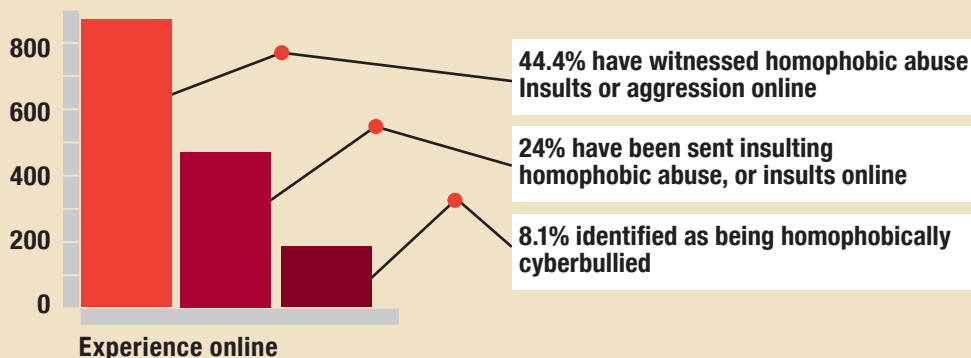


The Reach Cybersurvey

WE SURVEYED 1,969 YOUNG PEOPLE ABOUT HOMOPHOBIC BULLYING IN CYBERSPACE
HERE'S WHAT THE RESULTS SHOWED US

CYBERSPACE HAS BECOME A SIGNIFICANT ARENA FOR HOMOPHOBIC BULLYING



YOUNG PEOPLE WHO IDENTIFY AS BEING HOMOPHOBICALLY CYBERBULLIED ARE AT RISK IN A NUMBER OF WAYS ...AND SO ARE THEIR PEERS

<p>32% 22%</p> <p>Have had humiliating photos linked to gay insults</p>	<p>28% 15%</p> <p>Have been isolated because they are thought to be gay</p>	<p>39% 21%</p> <p>Have had rumours they are gay spread in cyberspace</p>	<p>28% 12%</p> <p>Being cyberbullied is linked to being bullied in school</p>

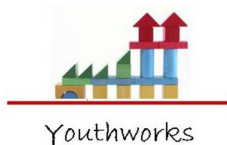
YOUNG PEOPLE WHO ARE HOMOPHOBICALLY CYBERBULLIED USE TECHNOLOGY REGULARLY WITHOUT e-SAFETY

<p>21% v 11%</p> <p>Twice as likely as peers to 'not really' or 'never' follow e-safety advice</p>	<p>65% v 80%</p> <p>Less likely than peers to think they are taught about e-safety at the right time</p>	<p>32% v 24%</p> <p>More likely than peers to use chatrooms</p>	<p>18% v 11%</p> <p>More likely than peers to be early adoptors of technology</p>
